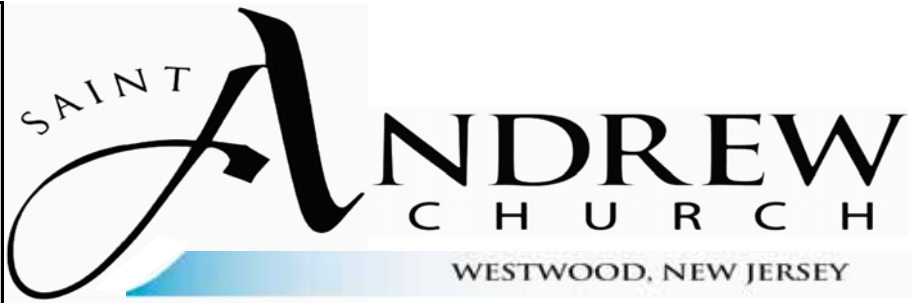

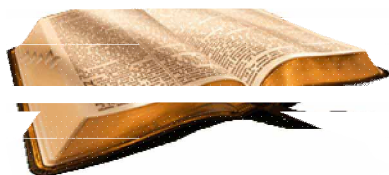

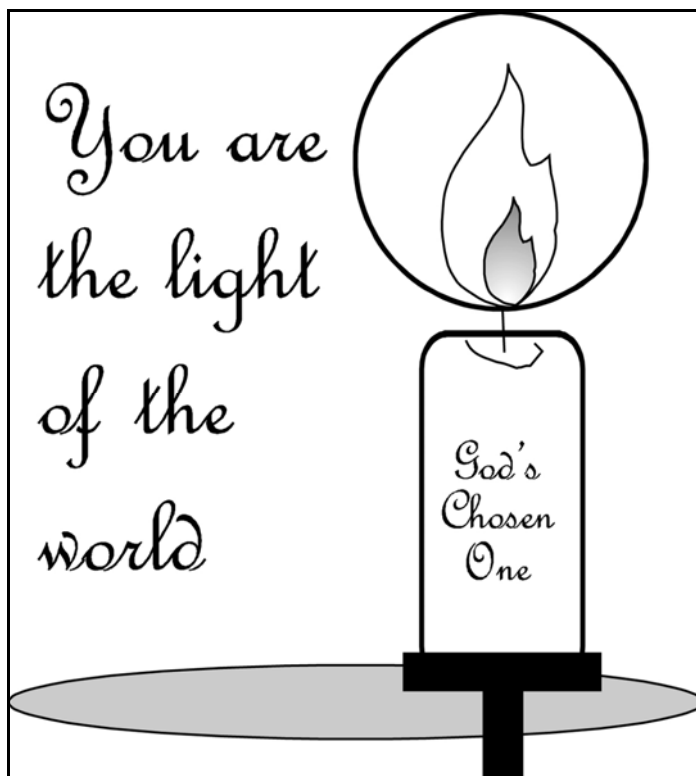


Voices that Challenge:
