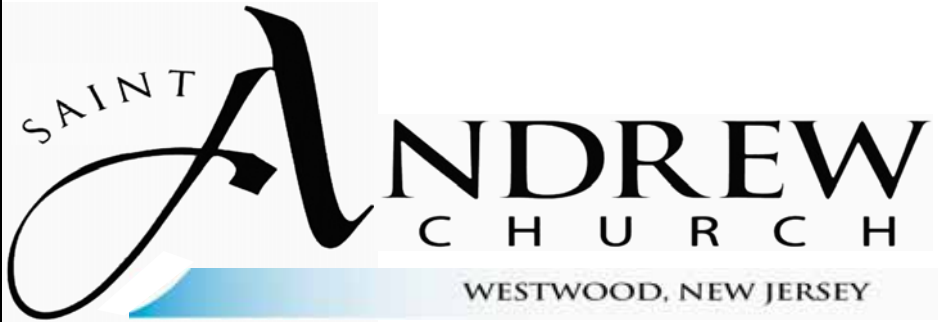

FOURTH SUNDAY OF LENT

Pastor's Letter

Dear Parish Family,

The Fourth Sunday of Lent is also known as "Laetare" Sunday. "Laetare" is a Latin word for "rejoice" or "rejoicing." Other nuances of the word include joyfulness, gladness, and happiness. This elated or jubilant mood is a striking one-day departure from the somber, sorrowful, penitential tone of the other days of Lent. On this Sunday, the color violet or rose is used. Rose is the liturgical color of joy. Also, instrumental music is permitted, and the altar may be decorated with flowers". There are multiple reasons why the Fourth Sunday of Lent is a cause for joy, the most important of which is the proximity of Easter. Easter is only three weeks away, and as it draws ever nearer, joy increases. For catechumens who are preparing to receive the Easter sacraments, they celebrate the Second Scrutiny on the Fourth Sunday of Lent. The thought of the upcoming Easter Vigil and the reception of the catechumens into the Church is cause for great joy for the catechumens themselves and the entire community.

In the gospel, we are presented with the story of the prodigal son. This is probably the best-loved story of all the parables of Jesus. It is the longest one and found only in the gospel of Luke. The story can be read from the perspective of each of the characters: the younger son, the older son, and the father. When we call it the parable of the of the "prodigal son", we are reading it from the perspective of the younger. But in the context in which Jesus told it, it was clearly about the father, the "parable of the prodigal father." The father was prodigal or wastefully extravagant, in his mercy and forgiveness. In the parable, the father represents God, who is rich in mercy and abounding in love, and the wayward son is every sinner – us. Christ is saying that after even the most stupid mistakes, the most degrading of sins, God will be looking for us and, with open arms, to take us back. All that is needed is an awareness and acceptance of our sinfulness. Always bear in mind that as long as we are ready to confess our sins to God and make that journey back to Him, God will always be there, waiting for us with open arms, ready to forgive us, like a prodigal father.

I would like to take this opportunity thank all of you for your stewardship and support to St. Andrew's, especially those who have already made their pledges for the "We Are Living Stones" Capital Campaign. Last weekend, the chairpersons mentioned that we have already received about \$75,000 in pledges – over and above our goal for our "Works of Mercy." As I mentioned previously, our campaign is just starting. This is the most crucial part of the campaign. Depending on the amount we continue to raise, 50% will be given back to St. Andrew's for our needed projects. For those who have not made any commitment or pledges yet, I am earnestly asking you to please prayerfully consider supporting this cause. The support of everyone is important for the success of our campaign.
