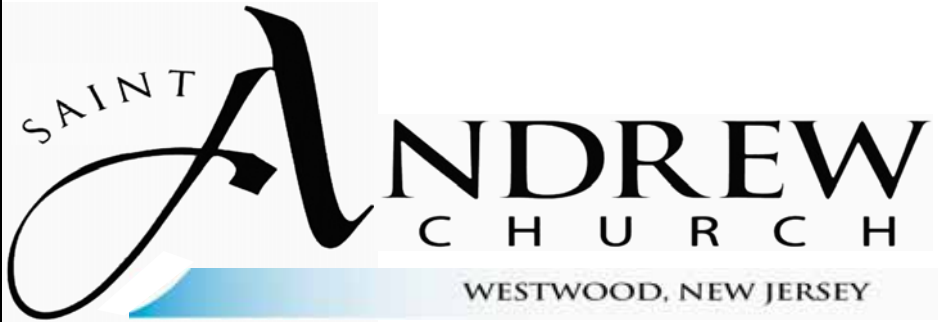

Dear Parish Family,

We celebrate the "World Day of Prayer for Vocations" this weekend. The theme, "We are God's People," was selected by Pope Francis for the occasion of the 53rd World Day of Prayer for Vocations. In his message, he invites all of us to reflect upon the apostolic community, and to give thanks for the role of the community in each person's vocational journey. The Pope further urges all the faithful to assume their responsibility for the care and discernment of vocations. As the Church throughout the world prays for vocations, will you make a special effort to ask the Lord for more vocations to the priesthood and religious life?

- Pray for the priests who have ministered to you throughout your life, both living and dead.
- Keep your parish priests and deacon in your prayers especially throughout this week.
- Encourage your children, grandchildren, or other lay people to consider a vocation as a priest or religious brother or sister.
- Pray the rosary for more young men and women in our Archdiocese to respond to God's call.

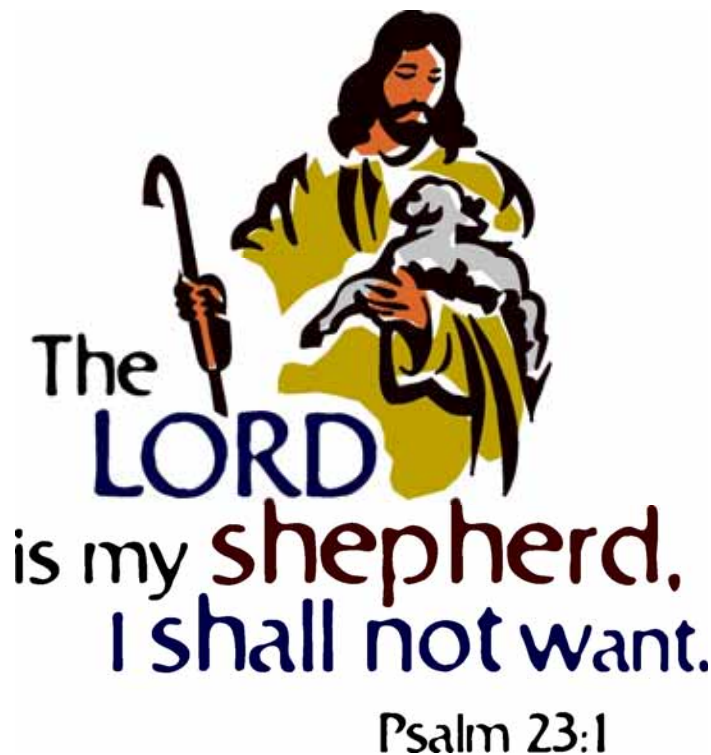
In 1963, Pope Paul VI designated the Fourth Sunday of Easter as Good Shepherd Sunday and as "World Day of Prayer for Vocations." Jesus, the Good Shepherd, protects us as His flock and promises us the gift of eternal life. In the gospel reading, Jesus identifies Himself as the shepherd. "My sheep hear my voice. I know them, and they follow me". On account of the infidelity of some shepherds to their divine office, God made this promise to His people that He Himself was going to be their Shepherd. This promise was fulfilled in Jesus who declared Himself to be the Good Shepherd who has come "that they may have life, and have it abundantly". He is the Good Shepherd who gives His life to His sheep at the cost of laying down His own life.

The work of shepherding God's flock is an ongoing task entrusted to the whole Church with Peter as head. The Pope, bishops and priests as well as any baptized person, all participate in various forms of ministering God's flock. As we pray for an increase in vocations, let us also pray for a better understanding and appreciation of the life and work of ordained ministers so that more and more people may avail themselves of the grace which God makes available through them. Let us also pray that more young people will be drawn to follow in their footsteps and answer God's call.
