### Pastoral Reflection

#### EXCERPTS FROM POPE FRANCIS'S MESSAGE FOR THE 50TH WORLD DAY OF PEACE, JANUARY 1, 2017: "NONVIOLENCE: A STYLE OF POLITICS FOR PEACE"

I wish peace to every man, woman and child, and I pray that the image and likeness of God in each person will enable us to acknowledge one another as sacred gifts endowed with immense dignity. Especially in situations of conflict, let us respect this, our "deepest dignity", and make active nonviolence our way of life.

... I would like to reflect on nonviolence as a style of politics for peace. I ask God to help all of us to cultivate nonviolence in our most personal thoughts and values. May charity and nonviolence govern how we treat each other as individuals, within society and in international life. When victims of violence are able to resist the temptation to retaliate, they become the most credible promoters of nonviolent peacemaking. In the most local and ordinary situations and in the international order, may nonviolence become the hallmark of our decisions, our relationships and our actions, and indeed of political life in all its forms.

... Violence is not the cure for our broken world. Jesus himself lived in violent times. Yet, He taught that the true battlefield, where violence and peace meet, is the human heart: for "it is from within, from the human heart, that evil intentions come" (Mk 7:21). But Christ's message in this regard offers a radically positive approach. He unfailingly preached God's unconditional love, which welcomes and forgives. He taught His disciples to love their enemies (Mt 5:44) and to turn the other cheek (Mt 5:39). He walked that path of nonviolence to the very end, to the cross, whereby He became our peace and put an end to hostility (Eph 2:14-16). Whoever accepts the Good News of Jesus is able to acknowledge the violence within and be healed by God's mercy, becoming in turn an instrument of reconciliation.

... Nonviolence is sometimes taken to mean surrender, lack of involvement and passivity, but this is not the case. (Examples include Mother Teresa in her dedication, touching and binding up every wounded body, healing every broken life, Mahatma Gandhi in the liberation of India, Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. in combating racial discrimination, and Leymah Gbowee and the Liberian women in ending the second civil war in Liberia.)

Such efforts on behalf of the victims of injustice and violence are not the legacy of the Catholic Church alone, but are typical of many religious traditions, for which "compassion and nonviolence are essential elements pointing to the way of life". I emphatically reaffirm that "no religion is terrorist". Violence profanes the name of God. Let us never tire of repeating: "The name of God cannot be used to justify violence. Peace alone is holy. Peace alone is holy, not war!"

If violence has its source in the human heart, then it is fundamental that nonviolence be practiced before all else within families. From within families, the joy of love spills out into the world and radiates to the whole of society. I plead for disarmament and for the prohibition and abolition of nuclear weapons: nuclear deterrence and the threat of mutual assured destruction are incapable of grounding such an ethic. I plead with equal urgency for an end to domestic violence and to the abuse of women and children.

... Applying the Beatitudes... is a challenge to build up society, communities and businesses by acting as peacemakers...by refusing to discard people, harm the environment, or seek to win at any cost. Active nonviolence is a way of showing that unity is truly more powerful and more fruitful than conflict.

... All of us want peace. In 2017, may we dedicate ourselves prayerfully and actively to banishing violence from our hearts, words and deeds, and to becoming nonviolent people and to build nonviolent communities that care for our common home. "Nothing is impossible if we turn to God in prayer. Everyone can be an artisan of peace".
