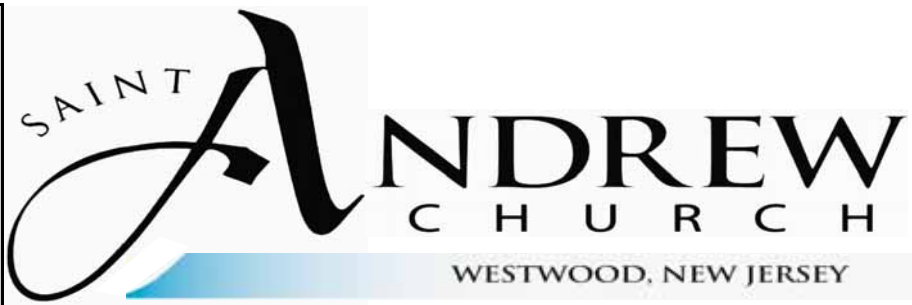

FOURTH SUNDAY OF LENT

Pastoral Reflection

Praying the Mass, part 2

The Liturgy of the Word is the easiest prayer in the world: We simply listen to God speak to us. It is like sitting in the sun. When the word of God is spoken at liturgy, God is speaking to us "live." We are not listening to something God once said. We are not being taught a lesson. The **living God here and now** is using these words to speak "live" to us.

God will say a special word to each of us at every Mass. It may be a word of comfort...or a nudge...or a new way of seeing things... but for sure, God speaks a tailor-made word to us. All we need to do is open ourselves up to take in the readings.

How do we do that? For starters, be really listening. Besides the three readings, we receive a fourth helping of Scripture from the Responsorial Psalm. The cantor sings the Word of God upon us and we respond by singing part of it as a refrain, over and over. Try humming or singing the refrain from the Psalm throughout the day.

Recall what took place at the feeding of the multitude. A large crowd was in need of food and the disciples told Jesus He should send them off to a nearby town where they could get something to eat. He responded: "You take care of them." They threw up their hands in frustration: "We can't. All we have are a few loaves and a couple of fish." Jesus said, "Bring me what you have." They did. Then He blessed the little they had, gave it back to them...and it was enough.

On any given day we can say what the disciples said. We stand before all the needs that surround us—family, friends, jobs, finances, unfinished tasks, personal struggles—and say, "Lord, I don't have what it takes." The Lord says to us, "Bring me what you have." We do at **The Presentation of the Gifts**. And the Lord will bless what we bring, and give it back to us at Communion. And, it will be enough.

The bread and wine represent our life. We also bring forward money. This is not simply a matter of "paying the rent." Money speaks the hard language of real life. It comes from our wallet, our purse, our budget, our job. When we give this to the Lord, we are also giving to ourselves.

St. Augustine said that at the Eucharist, everyone should come and stand on the altar. Which, of course, we cannot do, so we place ourselves on the altar through symbol. It is not enough to "pray" the Preparation of the Gifts. We simply think of our struggle to deal with everything going on in our lives and hear the Lord say, "Bring me what you have." Then we place it all on the altar.
