Pastor's Letter

Dear Parish Family,

You have seen the new statue of the Blessed Virgin Mary which we purchased from Italy for the May Crowning. I was so excited as I have seen many statues of the Blessed Virgin Mary in various images, forms and colors but, I have not seen anything as beautiful as the one we just purchased. Many of our parishioners were so excited and made many positive comments on how beautiful this statue is. I hope that this new statue will deepen and strengthen our devotion to Our Lady even more. The new statue of Our Lady will be erected outside, near the gazebo, where we plan to make a new garden. It would be a place where people could go and pray and meditate. Louis Currier, one of our parishioners, is doing his Eagle Scout project in conjunction with this same project. And, for those who have given us donations to help defray the costs of the statue, we thank you for your generosity.

Last Tuesday, May 23, our new Archbishop, Joseph William Cardinal Tobin, celebrated a solemn Mass for our deanery at Our Lady of Mercy. I thank all those from our parish who attended the Mass. After the concelebrated Mass, the new Archbishop had a "mini" town hall meeting or open forum where he was asked various questions on different concerns, topics and issues. What a wonderful opportunity for us who were present at the Mass to see and be with our new Archbishop. No doubt, our new shepherd is a good and holy man. I ask you to pray and support him in all his endeavors.

Since last year, our parish has incurred many expenses. Most of these expenses were for the repairs of our parish facilities. It started with the installation of a submersible pump for our chapel to avoid flooding again. Then, we have the repair of our air conditioning system in church-- the repair of its motors, the heating system and the cooling tower outside. Now, the big repair is the replacement of the church roof. The work is still ongoing. There is still the retaining wall in front of the parking area and the wall facing the parish center which need repairs. I was recently informed that the roof of the parish center also needs some repair at this time. Now, many of these necessary repairs were not budgeted for or have no budget at all. But, we cannot afford to just do nothing. The question is, where do we get the money to repair these needed facilities. It is true we get a second collection now and then for the repair of our facilities. But how much do we get from that collection? It is very minimal considering that our expenses are sometimes insurmountable. Our Sunday collections are also not very consistent as you may have observed. So, I come again to ask for your help. I know that many of you are very generous in your gift giving. But if you are able to give more in some way, please consider doing so. Even if you can just add an extra dollar or two from the regular amount that you are already giving, it would be a big help for us.

Thank you again for your generosity and stewardship. May God continue to bless you and your family.

EXCERPTS FROM THE MEMORIAL DAY HOMILY OF JOSEPH CARDINAL BERNARDIN OF CHICAGO - MAY 1985



...Memorial Day demands a simple eloquence because the real homilies have already been preached! The true sermons have already been proclaimed by the men and women we honor today: those who gave their lives for our country, and, indeed, all the faithful departed. Their pulpits were not in churches but on the battlefields. Their message was not so much spoken as lived out in countless deeds and quiet heroism. They were ordinary men and women who loved in an extraordinary way.

Today, we honor people who lived their faith, sometimes in unimaginable difficulty, but with utmost generosity. They died to protect and preserve freedom. They gave their lives for people they didn't know and for generations they would never meet. They died to end threats to the goodness and sacredness of life in the human family. We remember others because of the intimate ways they touched and shaped our lives, our beliefs, our values.

We best honor the memory of those who have preceded us by carrying on their dreams, beliefs and values. They believed in the preciousness of life. ... They believed in and loved the family. Let us carry on their dream. ... Many of those we honor today gave their lives because they believed in peace. As Christians, let us assume the responsibility of being peacemakers.

Memorial Day is a day of promises made and kept. We rejoice in prayer, grateful to God who keeps the promise of eternal life made to true believers. In honor of those who have gone before us, let us promise to respect life, to build the human family, and to build a peaceful world. May the Lord bring eternal rest and peace to all our loved ones.
