

Pastoral Reflection

STOLEN LOAF OF BREAD


During the Great Depression, a New York City woman was caught stealing a loaf of bread. Mayor Fiorello LaGuardia, the colorful mayor of New York City often rode with police and firefighters to get a sense of his city. On the night the woman appeared in court, Mayor LaGuardia was serving as the judge.

She told him she had taken the bread because her daughter was sick and had been abandoned by her husband and her grandchildren were starving. The shopkeeper refused to drop the charges. He wanted the conviction to teach people a lesson. Mayor LaGuardia thought for a moment and told the women he had to punish her because the law was quite clear. Her sentence was \$10 or 10 days in jail. But as he spoke, the mayor reached into his own pocket and drew out a \$10 bill. "Here is the \$10 fine which I now remit and furthermore, I am going to fine everyone in the room 50 cents for living in a town where a person has to steal bread so that her grandchildren can eat." The \$47.50 that was collected was given to the women.

This incident is a real life example of the parable in Matthew: "A man who was going on a journey called in his servants and entrusted his possessions to them. To one he gave five talents; to another, two; to a third one—to each according to his ability."

In this parable, Jesus is talking about the last judgement and how we will be accountable for how we use everything God gave us. We are supposed to use all our talents and possessions well. There is an important truth that lies at the core of everything: Everything we have belongs to God. That is the heart and soul of discipleship.

This is clear in the parable. The master entrusted his servants with his money, and they were to use it—not bury it or hoard it—on his behalf, to the best of their ability. Everything I have—my money, possessions, my abilities, my time, my talents, my opportunities—all belong to God. They are given to me so that I can use them well on God's behalf. This is a radical belief. O God, help me use your gifts well.
