## SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT

### A Note from Fr. Jim

My Dear Friends in Christ,

Now that we are off and running into the desert of Lent, perhaps it is a good time to call on you for some prayers. In a special way during this Lenten season, I ask your prayers for our Catechumen (one person who is preparing for full initiation into the Church — Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation at the Easter Vigil), our RCIA Candidates (4 adults preparing for Confirmation during the Easter Season) along with our young people who will make their Confirmation on Saturday, April 21. Last weekend, the Catechumens and RCIA Candidates gathered at the Cathedral Basilica in Newark for the Call to Continuing Conversion and the Rite of Election. This week, the young people of our Parish are gathered for their Confirmation Retreat to prepare for their special day in April. All of this is a good sign and reminder to us of the movement of the Holy Spirit here in our midst. When you pray, I ask that you remember all of our candidates.

With all that is going on in the world, I really think prayer is the answer. I once had a man say to me, "Oh, you are like all the other priests when there is nothing else to do, you simply say pray." I said, "Simply say pray. Oh no, I don't simply say pray. I say once you have prayed, start all over and start praying again. You don't pray when there is nothing else to do, you pray because it is one of the best and most powerful things we can do." We have to work hard to put God back in the center of our lives. That is what our RCIA Candidates, Catechumens and Confirmation candidates are doing. May we, through our Lenten sacrifices, service and prayer, strive to do the same and in doing so, impact the world around us.

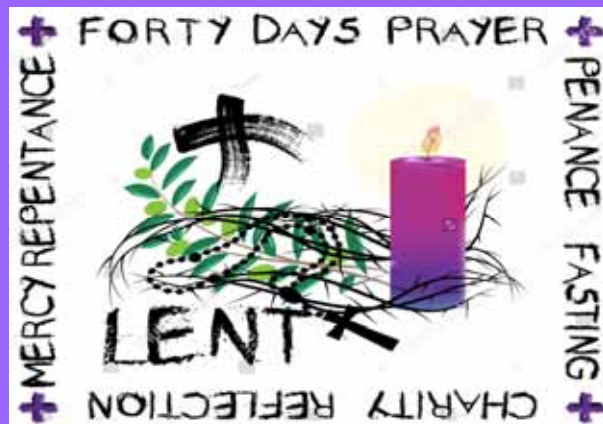
#### PRAYER FOR THE DISCOVERING CHRIST PROGRAM

TAKE ON THE CHALLENGE FOR LENT

#### CHANGING PEOPLE BY PRAYER

Sometimes our prayers are filled more with doubt than with confidence. We know that for God to answer our requests, our prayers must be in line with His will. However, wondering if we are praying according to His will can trip us up, and faced with the uncertainty, we will occasionally fall silent.

God's will is for each of us to have a healthy relationship with Him through His Son, Jesus Christ. That means knowing the Father with increasing intimacy and progressively becoming more and more like Jesus. By focusing our prayers on having this type of relationship with the Lord, it becomes easier to know what to pray. Simply find a Scripture that tells you something about God's character, and pray that for others and for yourself. The results are:

- ◆ You can pray with confidence because God wants His children to be like Jesus Christ.
- ◆ You can pray expectantly because you know He will work out His will in our lives.
- ◆ You can cooperate with the Holy Spirit while He works to develop the same quality in you.

Prayer is not a game of "I Spy," where we have to guess when to talk to the Lord about our concerns. Scripture is full of God's attributes and His desires for our lives. Pick one and start praying. Then watch what God does in response. Prayer gains access to the proud spirit, to the hardened heart, to the unbelieving mind; there are no walls too high or thick for Him to breach. So pray to follow God's will and watch lives change - especially your own.

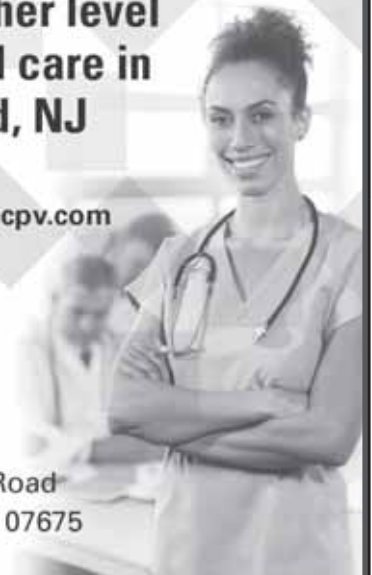
