

QUESTIONS CATHOLICS ASK IS THERE A "RIGHT TIME" TO BE CALLED BY GOD?

There is a right time to be called by God, and that time is right now! Regardless of who you are, where you have been, or where you are going, God calls you this very moment.



What does it mean to be called by God? It means that God desires to connect personally with each and every one of us and that our whole life is a response to God. We commit ourselves to a life relationship with a person, family, or community. We seek education in order to prepare

ourselves for a certain form of service in the world. We build a career using the gifts and talents we have been given. In these and other ways, we give ourselves to God.

There are also smaller, but no less significant choices, we make day-to-day in response to God's call: a kind word to a colleague, and opportunity to enjoy the rain, and extra effort to make a good project great.

The key is to be open to God's invitation to connect with Him here and now. In this way, we open ourselves to think, feel, and act from a graced place. FASTING

Often, we show our love by sacrificing, by giving something up. Sacrifice, in its various forms, out of love for the Lord Jesus is a powerful action that can yield great graces. For these reasons, the bishops of the United States have encouraged Catholics to make every Friday a day of self-denial and penitential witness in memory of the Lord's ultimate sacrifice for us. Self-denial can also take the form of giving something up that we most enjoy, or committing ourselves to works of charity.

Fasting and abstinence unites us to the redemptive suffering and death of our Lord. The practice of fasting: In the Latin Catholic Church, the penitential practice of fasting allows a person to eat one full meal each day. Two smaller meals may be taken, not to equal one full meal.

THE TRUE SPIRIT OF FASTING

Such exercises as fasting cannot have their proper effect unless our motives for practicing them spring from personal meditation. We have to think of what we are doing, and the reasons for our actions must spring from the depths of our freedom and be enlivened by the transforming power of Christian love. Otherwise, our self-imposed sacrifices are likely to be pretenses, symbolic gestures without real interior meaning. Sacrifices made in this formalistic spirit tend to be mere acts of external routine performed in order to exorcise interior anxiety and not for the sake of love. Sacrifices made in this fashion would be better left unmade. It would be more sincere as well as more religious to eat a full dinner in a spirit of gratitude than to make some minor sacrifice a part of it, with the feeling that one is suffering martyrdom.


