Notes from Fr. Jim

WHAT DO WE MEAN WHEN WE SAY IN THE APOSTLE'S CREED THAT "JESUS DESCENDED INTO HELL?"

Several parishioners have asked me to answer this question. First, let us look at the word "hell." The word immediately makes us think of a place of eternal damnation for those who have rejected God in this life and have committed mortal sins without repentance.

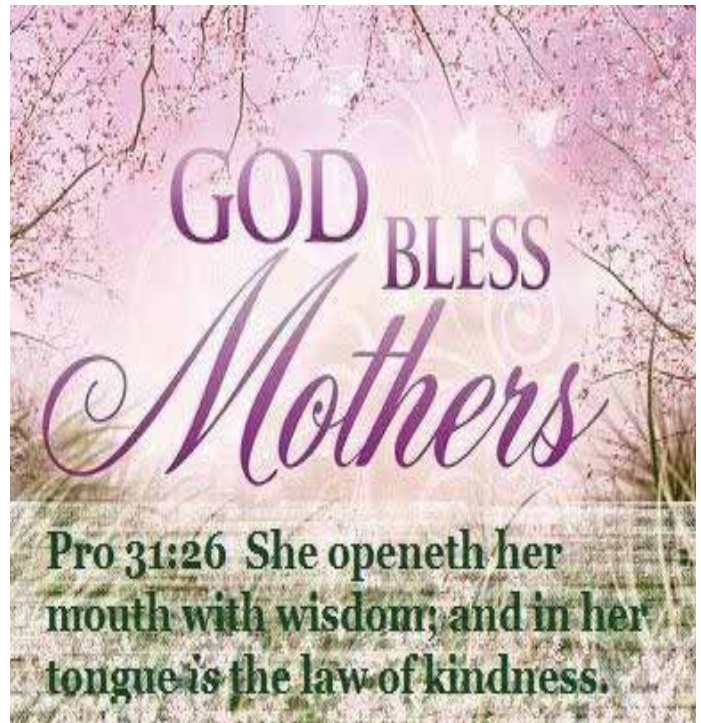
In the Old Testament, hell is called "sheol" in Hebrew texts and "hades" in Greek texts and referred to a place of the dead. Our English word, "hell", is derived from the Germanic name for the place of the dead in Teutonic mythology. This hell was for both the good and the bad, the just and the unjust. It was the nether world, a region of darkness. In later writings, a clear distinction is made between where the good resided in hell versus where the bad were, the two being separated by an impassable abyss. The section for the unjust was called "Gehenna", where souls would suffer eternal torment by fire. This is described in the parable of Lazarus (Luke 16:19-31).

We believe the sin of Adam and Eve closed the Gates of Heaven. The holy souls awaited the Redeemer in the land of the dead, or hell. Our Lord offered the perfect sacrifice for all sins by dying on the Cross, the redemptive act that touches people of every time - past, present, and future. He was then buried. During that time, Jesus descended among the dead: His soul, separated from His body, joined the holy souls awaiting the Savior in the Land of the Dead. St. Paul wrote, He "ascended". Therefore, He first "descended" into hell. Jesus' descent among the dead brought to completion the proclamation of the Gospel and liberated the holy souls that had long waited for the Redeemer. The Gates of Heaven were now open and these holy souls entered everlasting happiness enjoying the beatific vision.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church (No. 634) highlights the importance of this event. "This is the last phase of Jesus' Messianic mission, a phase which is condensed in time, but vast in its real significance: the spread of Christ's redemptive work to all men of all times and all places, for all who are saved have been made sharers in the redemption."

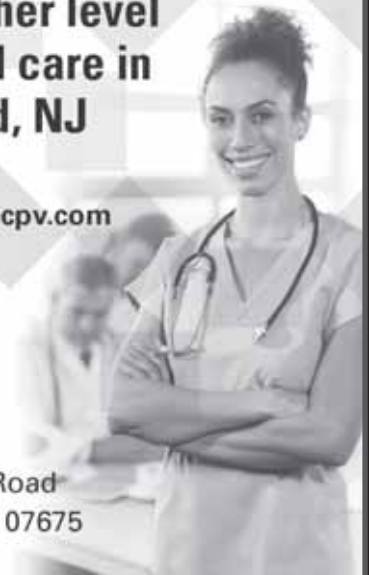

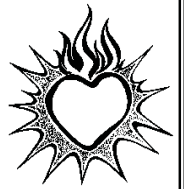

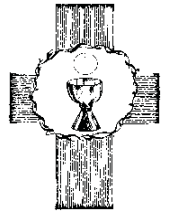
